Heard the parties.

The petitioner has moved this Court for grant of bail in connection with Saraiyahat P.S. Case No.91 of 2022 registered for the offences punishable under sections 394 of the Indian Penal Code and under Section 27 of the Arms Act.

The learned senior counsel for the petitioner submits that the allegation against the petitioner is that the petitioner committed robbery and caused injury to the informant and looted bag containing Tab, Aadhar Card, Pan Card, A.T.M. Card, Bank Register and Diary on the point of a pistol and also took away cash of Rs.26,270. It is further submitted that the allegations against the petitioner are all false and the petitioner is not named in the F.I.R. It is next submitted that without putting the petitioner on Test Identification Parade as mentioned in para -16 of the bail application, charge sheet has been submitted against him. It is next submitted that the petitioner has been in custody since 30.01.2026, as has been mentioned in paragraph no. 21 of the bail application. It is further submitted that the petitioner undertakes to cooperate with the trial of the case and further undertakes that he will not annoy or disturb the informant or the witnesses of the case in any manner during the trial of the case. Hence, it is submitted that the petitioner be admitted to bail.

The learned Spl. P.P. opposes the prayer for bail.

Considering the submissions of the counsels and the fact as discussed above, I am inclined to enlarge the above-named petitioner on bail. Accordingly, the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Judicial Magistrate -1st Class, Dumka, in connection with Saraiyahat P.S. Case No.91 of 2022 with the condition that the petitioner will co-operate with the trial of the case and will furnish his mobile number and photocopy of the Aadhar Card with an undertaking that he will not change his mobile number during the trial of the case, with further condition that he will not annoy or disturb the informant or the witnesses of the case in any manner during the trial of the case.
