2. The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in connection with Barhi P.S. Case No. 128 of 2022, registered for the offence under Sections 467, 468, 471, 341, 323, 448, 379, 354, 504, 506 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code, pending in the court of learned S.D.J.M., Hazaribagh.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and there is money transaction. He next submits that the allegation of threatening is also false. He further submits that the petitioner is having the criminal antecedents, however, in two of the cases, he has already been acquitted. On these grounds, he submits that anticipatory bail may kindly be provided to the petitioner.

4. Learned A.P.P. appearing for the State has opposed the prayer and submits that the petitioner is having five criminal antecedents and further allegations are also there of entering into the house and threatening and abusing the informant in filthy language. On these grounds, he submits that anticipatory bail may kindly be rejected.

5. Considering that the petitioner is having the criminal antecedents and on the forged agreement, the petitioner has sold the land to the informant and when the money was demanded, the petitioner has entered into the house and threatened the informant and also abused him in filthy language and in the attending facts and circumstances of the case, I am not inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, his prayer for anticipatory bail is rejected.
