This application has been preferred by the petitioner for grant of exemption to surrender in terms of Rule 159 of the Jharkhand High Court Rules.

Submission has been advanced by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is regularly paying the maintenance amount of Rs. 4,000/- per month to the opposite party no. 2. It has further been submitted that the petitioner is also bearing the expenses of his daughter who is studying M.B.A. However, save and except certain bank transactions from which it appears that the petitioner is making payment of maintenance of Rs. 4,000/- per month to the opposite party no. 2, there is no document which has been brought on record to strengthen the fact that the studies of the daughter of the petitioner is being financed by him. In fact, the learned counsel for the petitioner is unaware of the fact as to the institute where the daughter of the petitioner is pursuing her M.B.A.

In view of the above, therefore, I do not find any exceptional circumstance having been enumerated by the petitioner to grant him exemption to surrender and consequent thereof, this interlocutory application stands rejected.

I.A. No. 7351 of 2025 stands rejected.
