3. Learned counsels for the respondent- State in all the aforesaid cases submit that the petitions for condonation of delay have not been served upon them.
4. Learned counsel for the appellants undertakes to serve two copies of the petition for condonation of delay upon the State by 07th August, 2026.
5. At this, learned counsels for the State pray for some time to file reply to the aforesaid interlocutory applications.
6. The counter-affidavit to the aforesaid interlocutory applications be filed by 18th August, 2026.
7. Post these cases on 19th August, 2026 in the supplementary cause-list.
8. ***So far as other connected appeals*** are concerned which continue to be defective for one or the other reason, those cases are also directed to be posted along with aforesaid First Appeals on 19th August, 2026 in the supplementary cause-list.
9. The appellants in defective appeals are permitted to remove the surviving defects by 18th August, 2026 or file appropriate interlocutory application in connection with one or the other defect, if not already filed.
10. At this, the Learned counsel for the appellants has submitted that in the batch of cases which have been decided by the impugned judgment, the evidences are also common in all the cases and one set of records from the concerned court would be sufficient for the entire batch.
11. Office is directed to call for one set of records from the learned court concerned.
12. However, the question of entering into the merits of the case will certainly depend upon the appropriate order which are to be passed on the interlocutory application(s).
