2. The petitioner is apprehending her arrest in connection with
Cyber Crime P.S. Case No. 56 of 2025, registered for the offence under
Sections 318(2), 318(3), 318(4), 319(2), 336(2), 336(3), 338, 340(2),
61(2) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 and Sections 66(B), 66 (C),
66(D) of I.T Act, pending in the court of learned Additional Judicial
Commissioner-II-cum-Special Judge, Cyber Crime, Ranchi.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner is herself a victim of deceit and cyber fraud and for the
same a case has also been lodged by the petitioner, being Cyber Crime
Thana Jamshedpur P.S. Case No. 73 of 2025 as contained in
Annexure2 of the petition. He next submits that the petitioner is the
Secretary of the renowned Non-Government Organization, SHAPES
and has got no involvement in any manner whatsoever in the alleged
cyber fraud as narrated in the FIR. He further submits that the said
NGO is duly registered since 21.07.2013 and working for betterment
and upliftment of the society and receiving many awards and
certificates from dignitaries for the same and having a clear record
without any stains. He also submits that the allegations are made of a

credit of Rs. 11 lakhs and odd in the account of the said NGO and further the said amount has also been credited in the account of this petitioner, for that a complaint case has been lodged, which was subsequently sent for registration of the FIR and that has been registered as Cyber Crime Thana Jamshedpur P.S. Case No. 73 of 2025. He then submits that the petitioner is bed ridden, as she has received the spine injury. He further submits that the petitioner has also co-operated in the investigation and gone to the police and replied to the queries made by the I.O. On these grounds, he submits that anticipatory bail may kindly be provided to the petitioner.

4. Learned A.P.P. appearing for the State has opposed the prayer and submits that the allegations are there of crediting Rs. 11 lakhs and odd in the account of the NGO and further in the account of the petitioner. On this ground, he submits that anticipatory bail may kindly be rejected.

5. By the earlier order of this court, the case diary has been called, from which, it transpires that nothing has come in the case diary and further the petitioner has replied to the notice issued under Section 35(3) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 and she has also appeared before the I.O. as in course of the argument, it has been stated by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and further the said NGO is duly registered since 21.07.2013 and working for betterment and upliftment of the society and receiving many awards and certificates from dignitaries for the same and the petitioner has made a complaint with regard to the said transaction and pursuant to that Cyber Crime Thana Jamshedpur P.S. Case No. 73 of 2025 has been registered and the petitioner is having one criminal antecedent and disclosure to that effect has been made in para-28 of the petition, which has been lodged for the same allegation at Bengaluru in the State of Karnataka.

6. In the attending facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

7. Accordingly, the above-named petitioner is directed to surrender before the learned Court within three weeks from today and in the event of her arrest or surrender, he shall be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- (Twenty Five Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Additional Judicial Commissioner-II-cum-Special Judge, Cyber Crime, Ranchi, in connection with Cyber Crime P.S. Case No. 56 of 2025, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
