This application has been preferred by the petitioner to exempt the petitioner to surrender in terms of Rule 159 of the Jharkhand High Court Rules.

Submission has been advanced by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is ready to compromise the matter with the opposite party no.2.

It seems that the complaint was instituted in the year 2019 leading to the conviction of the petitioner vide judgment dated 21.02.2024, which was subsequently affirmed in appeal. The petitioner has merely made a vague statement about his intention to compromise the matter and having shown no bona fide in such intention, the same would not be an exceptional circumstance to allow the prayer of the petitioner for exemption to surrender.

Consequently, I.A. stands dismissed.
