1. Heard learned counsel for the parties.
2. The instant writ application has been preferred by the petitioners praying therein for the following reliefs:
 - i. *For issuance of appropriate writ(s), order(s), direction(s), specifically a writ in the nature of mandamus commanding upon the respondents to release the arrears of salary to the petitioners for the period between 01.01.1997 to 17.09.2008, in pursuance to Circular No.02/08, dated 14.10.2008 (Annexure-2), whereby, the benefit of pay-revision as on 01.01.1997 has been granted to the employees, but only w.e.f. the date of commencement of the circular, that is on 14.10.2008, and to that extent, to quash the limited portion of clause-1 of the circular by which, it has been commanded that the actual benefit may be granted w.e.f. the commencement of circular, that is on 18.09.2008;*
 - ii. *For issuance of appropriate writ(s), order(s), direction(s), specifically a writ in the nature of mandamus commanding upon the respondents to grant all consequential benefits, including arrears of salary and interest, in pursuance to allowing of prayer, as contained in Para-1(i);*
3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that

though the petitioners are fully entitled for the prayer made in the instant writ application; however, in spite of the repeated representations, the grievance of the petitioners has not been redressed.

4. Learned counsel for the respondents fairly submits that since no counter affidavit has been filed; as such the petitioners may be directed to approach the concerned respondent by filing a fresh representation, who shall look into the matter so that the grievance of the petitioner can be redressed.

5. Having regard to the aforesaid submissions and without going into the merits of the case, the instant writ application is partly allowed and the concerned respondent is directed to look into the grievance of the petitioners by treating this writ application as representation and take a decision in the matter in accordance with law and applicable rules and regulations by passing a reasoned and speaking order within a period of 10 weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order and communicate the same to the petitioners and all admitted dues, if any, shall be paid to the petitioners within a further period of 3 weeks.

6. One of the petitioners shall serve a copy of this writ application along with all relevant documents to the concerned respondent for convenience.

7. Pending I.A., if any, also stands closed.
