The instant interlocutory application has been filed on behalf of the appellant for condoning the delay of 41 days.

10. Put up this case after four weeks.
11. In the meantime, learned counsel for the CBI must file objection to said I.A. No. 17524 of 2025.
12. Let the name of Mr. Deepak Kumar Bharati be appeared on behalf of CBI in the cause list.
