ORDER

03.08.2026

1. The petitioner has filed this petition for grant of following reliefs:

“(a)Writ of certiorari, quashing the order of respondent No. 2 with Reference No. HPC/SUIS/JK/KSR/01/2 dated 24.10.2025 cancelling the allotment process on the arbitrary grounds of the closure of the Stand-Up India Scheme (SUIS) Credit Guarantee framework by Government of India.

(b)Writ of Certiorari, quashing the letter No. HPC/CMD/LPG/718/NZ dated 25.06.2026 of respondent No. 4 rejecting the petitioner's detailed representation and confirming the arbitrary cancellation.

(c)Writ of Mandamus, directing the respondents to accept the Collateral coverage and third party guarantee for sanctioning of loan amounting to Rs. 60 lakhs for purchase of two Gas Tankers 1.5 MT LPG containers in furtherance of letter No. HPC/SUIS/JK/KSR/01 dated 09-10-2025 issued by respondent No. 5 and issuance of letter of acceptance/ allotment in favour of the petitioner.



(d) Writ of mandamus, commanding the respondents to initiate a fresh bidding process by inviting bids for bulk LPG transportation for Jammu and Kashmir. ”

2. Mr. R. P Sharma, learned Senior counsel has caused appearance and has submitted that work in question stands already allotted to other eligible bidders, as such, the present petition is not maintainable, more particularly, in view of the relief (d) sought by the petitioner.
3. Besides assailing order dated 24.10.2025 cancelling the allotment process on the ground of closure of SUIS scheme and communication dated 25.06.2026 whereby the representation of the petitioner was rejected, the petitioner has also sought the directions to the respondents to initiate a fresh bidding process by inviting bids for bulk LPG transportation for Jammu and Kashmir.
4. In view of the statement made by Mr. R. P. Sharma, learned Senior counsel, that the bulk LPG transportation contract works have already been assigned, as such, the relief sought by the petitioner cannot be granted.
5. Accordingly, the present petition is **dismissed**.
