**ORAL ORDER**

Sri A Chandrachud, the learned Central Government Counsel for the first to third respondents, is permitted to file memo of appearance for these respondents.

Sri Saravana S, the learned counsel for the petitioner, submits that the petitioner's cause for a direction to the respondents to renew the lease to run a *milk stall* at Concourse, Bengaluru City Railway Station is well founded.

Sri Aravind Kamath, the learned ASG, inviting this Court's attention to the License Agreement dated 10.02.2023, submits that **[a]** the petitioner cannot insist upon renewal as a right and if the petitioner has no right to insist on renewal, he will not be able to maintain the petition **[b]** the petitioner's locus is impeded because the agreement is with M/s. Karnataka Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Limited and not the petitioner.

When queried as to why the petition must not be disposed of in the light of the afore, Sri Saravana S submits that the petition may be called on 09.02.2026.

The office is directed to re-list this petition on **09.02.2026.**
