ORDER

- i) IA No.2/2026 is ***allowed.***

- ii) Execution of judgment and award dated 07.01.2026 passed in MVC No.63/2024 by XVI Additional Judge, Court of Small Causes and MACT, Bengaluru (SCCH-14) is stayed subject to following conditions:
- a) The appellant shall deposit 50% of the award amount with interest within a period of 06 weeks from this day.
 - b) The Tribunal shall disburse the said amount to claimants.
 - c) If claimants are not withdrawn the said amount within a period of 06 weeks after deposit, the Tribunal shall keep the said amount in fixed deposit in any nationalized bank for a period of one year with auto renewal instructions.

Issue notice on IA No.1/2026 and appeal to respondent No.1.

List this matter on 05.10.2026.
