ORAL JUDGMENT

(PER: HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE S.SUNIL DUTT YADAV)

The Writ Petitions are filed by employees who form part of a batch of 27 employees who are working under the *Government of Karnataka Population Control Project* (for short, '**project**') and in light of identical contentions raised they are clubbed and disposed of by a common judgment.

2. The parties are referred to as per their ranking before the Writ proceedings, for the sake of convenience.

3. The present Writ Appeals are filed by the State who was the respondent in the writ proceedings and have called in question correctness of the order passed by the Learned Single Judge in W.P. No. 103618 of 2023 and connected matters.



4. The Petitioners in the writ proceedings had filed the Writ Petitions seeking for setting aside of the endorsement dated 15.02.2023 issued by the Directorate of Health and Family Welfare Department. In terms of the said endorsement, a decision was taken that the petitioners' merging or regularisation with the Department is impermissible as the petitioners were working under the **Project** (IPP-8). The endorsement further recites that the Junior Women Health Assistants cannot be regularised as the Rules do not provide for the same nor could there be merger of their employment with that of the Department. The endorsement further provides that the pay scale which is in the nature of an honorarium would be increased to Rs.15,000/- from Rs.6,000/-.

5. The Petitioners had contended that they have been working under the said **Project** since 2001 and were entitled to be regularised taking note of the law laid down by the Apex Court, In Uma Devi's case (Secretary, State Of Karnataka and Others vs Umadevi and Others) reported in AIR 2006 SUPREME COURT 1806.



6. Before the learned Single Judge, contention was also raised that the endorsement does not advert to the aspect of regularisation in a proper perspective as though a decision is taken rejecting request for regularization, however, they continue to work under the same **Project**. It is further submitted that the increase in remuneration also reflected continuing of their services.

7. The learned Single Judge by a detailed Order has allowed the petition and set aside the endorsement and has directed reconsideration of the case of the petitioners. The relevant observations made by the rendered Single Judge at paragraphs no. 7 to 9 reads as follows.

"7. This Court considered identical circumstances of two of the employees, who had served for 39 years and 33 years respectively therein. The petitioners in the case at hand, as on today rendered 24 years of service. The Apex Court considers the very circumstance of those petitioners therein being appointed under the Scheme or work charge establishment issued. In that light, the endorsement that is issued to the petitioners rejecting the claim needs to be noticed.

8. The endorsement does not whisper about the claim for regularization, but observes that the salary of rupees six thousand that was paid for the last 22 years would now be increased to rupees fifteen thousand, which is not even the minimum wage. Therefore, it is a clear case that the services of the petitioners are continued for 24 years, they be left in the lurch today. This is the elucidation of the Apex Court in the case of SHRIPAL VS. NAGAR NINGAM ².

9. The other circumstances is that the learned HCGP further projects another circumstances that the judgment in the case of UMADEVI (3) supra was regularization is one time measure and those who have not 2 2025 SCC OnLine SC 221 been found fit for regularization then cannot claim regularization at a later point in time. This submission is noted only to be rejected as the Apex Court in the subsequent judgment, recorded after UMADEVI (3) supra in the case of M.L. KESARI VS. STATE OF KARNATAKA³ has considered this aspect and directed the persons who had not been regularized, are open to be regularized later and observes that it was again for one time measure. The subsequent judgments that have been considered by this Court supra would steer clear the issue. Therefore, the cases of these petitioners should merit consideration bearing in mind the observations made in the course of this order."

8. Clearly the Learned Single Judge has found the endorsement to be irregular and finding that the petitioners had continued for about 24 years and taking note of the judgment of the Apex Court in ***Shripal Vs. Nagar Nigam***



(2025 SCC Online SC 221), direction has been made for consideration of the case of the petitioners for regularisation after setting aside the endorsement. Observations made are self-explanatory. The continuing need of the services of the petitioner is reflected in enhancing of the emoluments from Rs.6,000/- to Rs.15,000/-. If that were to be so, we find no reason to interfere with the observations made by the learned Single Judge. Accordingly, the Writ Appeals are rejected. The directions of the learned Single Judge to be complied with, as is ordered, within a period of three months.

Pending interim applications also stand disposed of.

In light of disposal of the Writ Appeals, the contempt proceedings are dropped reserving liberty to take appropriate action at an appropriate point of time.
