1. Heard Mr. P.R.Paske, learned counsel for the petitioner.
2. Issue notice.
3. Mr. A.Kumar, learned Advocate General assisted by Ms. R.Colney, learned GA is present and accepts notice on behalf of the respondents No. 1, 2 & 3, as such, no further notice is required on these respondents.
4. Notice to issue to the private respondents within three days.
5. The challenge in the writ petition is to the selection list whereby it is contended that one of the selected candidates is the son of the Vice Chairman



of the District Selection Committee which conducted the selection. It is further submitted that inspite of the fact that the writ petitioner secured the highest marks in the written examinations, the District Selection Committee with a malafide intent had awarded him lowest marks in the personal interview, which resulted in his obtaining the 10th position against 9 vacant posts. He therefore, prays for appropriate orders and directions at this stage to stay the further appointment of the selected candidates.

6. Learned Advocate General on behalf of the respondents has produced a communication under the hand of the Member Secretary, District Selection Committee, wherein it is indicated that after the final results were declared on 02-04-2026, the selected candidates have since been duly appointed and have already joined their posts. He therefore, submits at this stage, no interim orders are called for.

7. This Court, on hearing the learned counsel for the parties and also on examination of the materials, notes that the contention of the writ petitioner that he had secured the 10th position, and also the highest marks on the written examination is correct, however, as it is submitted that the appointments have since been accorded, no interim orders will be passed at this stage.



8. However, it is directed that the State respondents file an affidavit within three weeks from today. Petitioner is also directed to file an affidavit with the list of the Members of the District Selection Committee.

9. Needless to add, the entire selection process will be subject to the outcome of the writ petition.

10. List this matter on 23-06-2026.
