By this petition, the petitioners i.e., the petitioner No. 1 (accused) and the petitioner No. 2 (prosecutrix) seek quashing of the FIR registered with R-Bhoi Women Police Station, Ri-Bhoi District and consequently, the proceeding pending before the learned Special Judge, POCSO, Ri-Bhoi District, Nongpoh. Quashing is sought by consent.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that at the time of the incident, the petitioner No. 1 was aged 22 years and the petitioner No. 2 was 15 years old. She further submits that the physical relationship between the petitioners was consensual. She further submits that from the said relationship, the parties have a child, who is 4 years old. She further states



that today, the petitioner No. 1 is 27 years and the petitioner No. 2 is aged 19 years 10 months. Learned counsel further states that the petitioners have got married on 12.03.2026. She relied on the Marriage Certificate, which is at page 97 of the petition.

3. In addition, learned Addl PP to submit a report from the Officer concerned of the concerned Police Station with respect to whether the petitioners are living together as husband and wife; whether what is stated in the petition is true and correct.

4. Having heard learned counsel for the petitioners, issue notice to the respondents returnable on **7th July, 2026**.

5. Mr S. Sengupta, learned Addl PP waives notice on behalf of the respondent No. 1.

6. In addition to Court notice, learned counsel for the petitioners to serve the respondent No. 2 by private/dasti notice and file affidavit of service before the next date.



7. Having heard learned counsel for the petitioners, in the meantime, till the next date, the proceeding before the trial court shall stand stayed.
