[1] Ms. B Nandita, learned counsel appeared on behalf of petitioner, Mr. D Julius Riamei, learned counsel appeared on behalf of respondents No. 2 & 3 and Ms. Jyotsana, learned counsel appeared on behalf of respondent No. 1.

[2] This is to be read in conjunction with and in continuation of the earlier proceeding dated 17.08.2026, which reads as under:-

"17.08.2026

Ms. B. Nandita, learned counsel appeared on behalf of the petitioner; Mr. M. Devananda, learned Senior Advocate and Addl. AG assisted by Ms. N. Jyotsana, learned counsel appeared on behalf of the State respondents and Mr. D. Julius Riamei, learned counsel appeared on behalf of the respondents No. 2 and 3.

The counsel appearing for the respondents No. 2 and 3 submitted that WP(C) No. 635 of 2024 has been filed challenging

the order dated 08-08-2024 issued by the Manipur Tribal Development Corporation Ltd., by which the petitioner had been placed under suspension in contemplation of a Departmental Enquiry. The learned counsel submitted that the impugned suspension order has been revoked by the authorities by issuing an order dated 11-08-2026 and a copy of the said revocation order is placed before this court and a copy has already been furnished to the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner.

In view of the subsequent events, the learned counsel appearing for the respondents No. 2 and 3 submitted that the present writ petition has become infructuous and the same can be closed.

Mr. D. Julius Riamei, learned counsel further submitted that WP(C) No. 656 of 2024 had been filed assailing the order dated 10-04-2024 issued by the Manipur Tribal Development Corporation Ltd. constituting a Fact-Finding Committee and with a prayer for quashing this impugned order. The learned counsel submitted that the said impugned order dated 10-04-2024 has also been superseded by another order dated 24-04-2025 issued by the Manipur Tribal Development Corporation Ltd. and as such, the said writ petition has also become infructuous and the same can be closed.

Ms. B. Nandita, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner seeks three days' time to get instruction from the writ petitioners and to revert back to this court with regard to the submission made by Mr. D. Julius Riamei, learned counsel appearing for the respondents No. 2 and 3.

In view of the submission made above, let these cases be listed again on 21-08-2026."

[3] When these matters are taken up today, the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that she has received instructions from the petitioner that WP (C) No. 656 of 2024 and WP (C) No. 635 of 2024 along with MC (WP (C)) No. 532 of 2024 and MC (WP (C)) No. 547 of 2024 have been rendered infructuous in view of the order dated 11.08.2026 issued by the respondents revoking the suspension order of the petitioner and order dated 24.04.2025 issued by the Manipur

Tribal Development Corporation Ltd., subsequent to the filing of the present writ petition. The learned counsel accordingly submitted that both the aforesaid 2 writ petitions as well as the 2 connected miscellaneous applications can be closed as infructuous.

[5] Recording the submission made by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner, the present 2 writ petitions along with the connected 2 applications are hereby closed as infructuous.
