1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Mode.
 2. Heard learned counsel for appearing for the Parties.
 3. The present Writ Petition has been filed, *inter alia*, with the following prayers:-

"It is therefore prayed that, this Hon'ble court may graciously be pleased to admit this writ application and issue Rule "NISI" in calling upon the Opp. Parties to show cause as to

(i) Why, the Opp. Parties will not be directed to sanction and disburse the final pension w.e.f. 31.03.2014 and pay the arrear as well as current pension within a stipulated period; and

(ii) Why, the Opp. Parties will not be directed to sanction and disburse other post-retirement benefits as due and admissible with bank interest to the petitioner within a stipulated period;

And any other relief/reliefs be passed to which the petitioner is entitled;



And/or pass any other order/orders, writ /writs direction/directions, as this Hon'ble Court, deems fit and proper in the eye of law.

And for such act of kindness the petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray.”

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the Petitioner states that highlighting his grievances, the Petitioner has made a representation to Opposite Party No.2 vide Annexure-5 and the same may be directed to be considered within a stipulated time, to which learned Counsel for the State has no objection.

5. As agreed by learned counsel for the parties and after going through the records, this Court, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the Writ Petition directing Opposite Party No.2 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-5 within a period of three (3) months from the date of production of certified copy of this order in accordance with law and communicate the result thereof to the Petitioner.

Accordingly, the Writ Petition stands disposed of.
