30. This matter is taken up through Hybrid arrangement (video conferencing/physical mode).

This is an application filed by the State with a prayer for grant of three months' time to conduct review DPC and submit the same before this Hon'ble Court in sealed cover in compliance to the order dated 10.09.2025.

In the interim application, the relevant portion read as under:

"5. That the petitioners have highest regards to the direction of the Hon'ble



Court. The petitioner has no intention to undermine the order passed by this Hon'ble Court. Since this a question of review DPC of the year 2012 and in order to convene a review DPC, the service record/CCRs of more than 200 persons has to be obtained from the concerned controlling authorities of the said eligible employees and needs to be scrutinized, which will take some more time. In case any mistake takes place in the review DPC, it may lead to further litigation. Therefore, it will take time to comply the order dated 10.09.2025.

6. That in view of the above facts and circumstances, unless this Hon'ble Court may kind enough to grant three months' time to comply the order dated 10.09.2025, the petitioners will be seriously prejudiced."

A copy of the interim application has been served on the learned counsel for the opp. parties, who have no such objection for holding the review DPC as per the order of this Court dated 10.09.2025, but raised the objection to the longer period sought for by the State to conduct such review DPC.

After hearing the learned counsel for the respective parties and going through the averments taken in the interim application, we grant two months' time to comply with the order dated 10.09.2025. It is made clear that no further extension of time shall be



granted to the State.

Accordingly, the I.A. is disposed of.
