1. Heard Mr. B.P. Mohanty, learned counsel appearing for the appellant-wife and Mr. Kamalakanta Sethi, learned counsel for the respondent-husband.
2. Despite our earlier order dated 25.03.2026, the respondent-husband, Dip Shankar Manna did not appear in the Court today without filing any application and also has not yet deposit the amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs) till now.
3. During deliberation of the matter, Mr. Kamalakanta Sethi,



learned counsel for the respondent-husband, submitted that the said respondent-husband would deposit the said amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs) by today itself immediately during the recess, and to that extent, learned counsel Mr. Kamalakanta Sethi, placed the copy of the Demand Draft No.199171 dated 27.04.2026 issued by the State Bank of India, Cuttack Branch amounting to Rs. 5,00,000/- payable in favour of the Registrar (Judicial), High Court of Orissa in the present matrimonial appeal.

4. On being deposited the said amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- by the respondent-husband, as per our earlier direction dated 25.03.2026, the Registrar (Judicial), High Court of Orissa shall invest the said amount in a high interest-yielding short-term deposit scheme in any Nationalized Bank with an Auto-Renewal Clause, to the credit of the appeal. The appellant-wife on being advised may file appropriate application on behalf of her minor son for withdrawal of the said amount with proper explanations, if so desires.

5. Mrs. Aparajita Deep Manna-appellant-wife along with her minor son Daivik Shankar Manna duly represented by their learned counsel has appeared in person before this Court today. On the other hand, the respondent-husband, Dip Shankar Manna remained absent before the Court today and without complying our order dated 25.03.2026 that too without even filing any appropriate application seeking time for his personal appearance. Accordingly, respondent-husband, Dip Shankar Manna is directed to remain personally present before the Court tomorrow



(25.06.2026) at 10.30 a.m., failing which the Court shall consider to pass consequential order against him.

6. List this matter on 25th June, 2026 (tomorrow). The matter will be taken up at 10.30 a.m.

7. Personal appearance of the appellant-wife Mrs. Aparajita Deep Manna and her minor son Daivik Shankar Manna are dispensed with until further order of this Court.

8. As this order has been passed in presence of Mr. Kamalakanta Sethi, learned counsel for the respondent-husband, no formal notice need to be issued to the respondent-husband-Dip Shankar Manna and Mr. Kamalakanta Sethi, learned counsel to communicate this order to the said respondent-husband.

9. Copy of this order shall be uploaded in the High Court portal during the course of the day.

10. Further, the Registry shall submit a report regarding deposit of said Bank Draft of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs) by the respondent-husband pursuant to our earlier order dated 25.03.2026.
