1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. This is the 2nd bail application U/S.483 of BNSS by the petitioner for grant of bail in connection with Dhenkanal Sadar PS Case No.30 of 2025 corresponding to CT (Sessions) Case No.104 of 2025 pending in the file of learned Sessions Judge, Dhenkanal, for commission of offences punishable U/Ss.331(4)/305 (a)/326(g)/112(2)/3(5)/336(2)/340(2) of BNS, on the main allegation of committing theft of Rs.8,96,300/- from the SBI ATM near Jagannath Petrol Pump, Dhenkanal.
3. Heard, Mr. Manas Kumar Chand, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. P. Satpathy, learned Addl. Public Prosecutor in the matter and perused the record.
4. After having considered the rival submissions and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of



the offences as alleged against the petitioner vis-a-vis the accusations sought to be brought against him and regard being had to the pre-trial detention of the petitioner in custody since 10.01.2025 with framing of charge in the meantime and keeping in view the recovery of substantial amount of cash in this case and taking into account grant of bail to co-accused Sadam Majid Hussain @ Sadam Hussain in BLAPL No.13343 of 2025, Rafique Khan in BLAPL No.13504 of 2025 and Mohammad Nasir @ Mohammad Nasir @ Md. Nasir in BLAPL No.9822 of 2025, this Court without expressing any view on merits admits the petitioner to bail.

5. Hence, the bail application of the petitioner stands allowed and the petitioner is allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand) only with two solvent sureties each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin of the case on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it.

6. Accordingly, the BLAPL stands disposed of. A soft copy of this order be immediately communicated to the concerned Court, who shall afterwards communicate the same to the concerned Jail through e-mail for reference.
