1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. Since these two bail applications arise out of one and same case record, the same are heard together and disposed of by this common order with the consent of the learned counsel for the parties.
3. These are the bail applications U/S.483 of BNSS by the petitioners for grant of bail in connection with CT Case No. 17 of 2026 arising out of Raikia PS Case No. 02 of 2026 pending in the file of learned Special Judge-cum-Addl. District & Sessions Judge, Balliguda for commission of offences punishable U/Ss. 20(b)(ii)(B)/29 of the NDPS Act, on the main allegation of jointly possessing 7Kgs & 650 Grams of Contraband Ganja.



4. Heard, Mr. Jagannath Bhuyan, learned counsel for the Petitioners in BLAPL No. 398 of 2026; Mr. Bibhu Prasad Chhualsingh, learned counsel for the Petitioners in BLAPL No. 1365 of 2026 and Mr. M.R. Patra, learned Additional Public Prosecutor in the matter and perused the record.

5. After having considered the rival submissions and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offences as alleged against the petitioners vis-à-vis the accusations sought to be brought against them and regard being had to the pre trial detention of the petitioners in custody since 06.01.2026(Anala Kumar Nayak @ Tuku & Chandan Nayak) & 05.01.2026(Noor Islam Sekh & Mannan Hosen Mandal) and no criminal antecedent of similar nature having reported against the Petitioners and the quantity of Contraband Ganja allegedly seized in this case being for intermediate quantity and thereby, the provisions of Section 37 of NDPS Act being not attractable, this Court without expressing any view on merit admits the petitioners to bail.

6. Hence, these two bail applications of the petitioners namely Anala Kumar Nayak @ Tuku & Chandan Nayak and Noor Islam Sekh & Mannan Hosen Mandal in BLAPL Nos. 398 & 1365 of 2026 are allowed and each of the petitioners is allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand) each with two solvent sureties for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin



of the case on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it.

7. Accordingly, these BLAPL Nos. 398 & 1365 of 2026 stand disposed of. Issue urgent certified copy of the order as per Rules. A soft copy of this order be immediately communicated to the concerned Court, who shall afterwards communicate the same to the concerned Jail through e-mail for reference.
