1. The CRLMP was taken up on 06.02.2026 on special notice on being mentioned by the Petitioner in person. So the Petitioner submitted that he was unable to enter his house to meet his parents as one Subhashree Asrayalata Das was creating disturbance, the IIC, Begunia Police Station had been directed to extend protection to the Petitioner to enable him to enter his house to meet his parents.
2. On 18.02.2026 Mr. S. Das, learned counsel appearing on behalf of Petitioner stated that he has filed Vakalatnama on his behalf. The case was adjourned to today to enable learned Additional Standing Counsel to obtain instructions.
3. Instructions dated 24.02.2026 of the IIC of Begunia Police Station are produced in Court. Perusal of the same reveals that while the Petitioner was staying in the house of the parents, on 18.02.2026 Subhashree Asrayalata Das reached there and there was an



altercation between the parties, which was brought under control with the intervention of the Police staff of Begunia Police Station. On 20.02.2026, case and counter case was registered vide Begunia P.S. Case No.83 dated 20.02.2026 under Sections 126(2)/296/115(2)/74/303(2)/351(2)/3(5) of the BNS and Begunia P.S. Case No.84 dated 20.02.2026 under sections 126(2)/296/351(2)/115(2) BNS. After much persuasion, Subhashree Asrayalata Das returned to her parental house situated at Arahata, Purukia under Banarpal Police Station, Dist. Angul and the Petitioner returned to his place of duty. One ASI in-charge of Gadamanitri Beat House has been directed to keep close watch over the movements of the Petitioner and the latter has been advised to intimate the local police prior to his arrival at his native place in order to maintain peace and harmony. Similarly, Subhashree Asrayalata Das has been advised to seek police assistance during her visits and to avail appropriate orders from the Court before taking further steps regarding her residence.

4. This Court is of the opinion that in view of the developments the CRLMP should be disposed of without any further direction as the Petitioner has already visited the house of his parents.

5. The CRLMP is accordingly disposed of without issuing any further direction.
