1. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Mode.
2. Heard learned counsel appearing for the Parties.
3. The Present Writ Petition has been filed inter alia with the following prayer:

In view of the above, it is most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to:

1. Issue a direction to the opposite parties to regularise the service of the petitioner under the regular establishment with retrospective effect or in alternative direct the Opp. Parties to issue a fresh regularisation order in favour of the petitioner regularising him with retrospective effect, thereby enabling him to receive all consequential financial and service benefits, including eligibility for pension under the Odisha Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1992

2. Direct the opposite parties to grant the petitioner all benefits arising from the retrospective regularization of his service, as per the applicable rules, including all other benefits



And/Or pass such other order/orders as may be deemed fit and proper for the interest of justice. And, for this act of kindness the petitioners as in duty bound shall ever pray.

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the Petitioner states that highlighting his grievances, Petitioner has made a representation before the Opp. party No.1 vide Annexure-5 and the same may be directed to be considered within a stipulated time, to which learned Counsel for the State has no objection.

5. As agreed by learned counsel for the parties and after going through the records, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the Writ Petition directing Opposite Party No.1 to consider and dispose of the representation vide Annexure-5 to the Writ Petition, in accordance with law, within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of this order with due communication to the Petitioner.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition stands disposed of.
