1. Heard.
2. The petitioner by invoking the writ jurisdiction of this Court, inter alia, making the following relief:-

“In the circumstances, stated above it is humbly prayed that this Hon’ble Court may be graciously pleased to admit writ application, issue notice to the Opp. Parties, and after hearing the parties, be pleased to direct the Opp. Parties to release the victim compensation amount to the petitioner under the Victim Compensation within stipulated time period for the interest of justice.”

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is the informant in the F.I.R. dated 16.10.2020 in Koraput Sadar P.S. Case No.119 of 2020. As per the allegations made in the F.I.R., the accused persons committed the murder of the petitioner’s mother and, therefore, in terms of the



Notification dated 20.10.2018 issued by the Home Department, Government of Odisha, the petitioner is entitled to victim compensation. In that regard, an application has already been filed, which is annexed as Annexure-3 series.

4. It appears from the record that the said application is incomplete. The L.Rs Certificate reveals that along with the present petitioner, there are other brothers and sisters, who are also entitled for the compensation, if any to be paid. Non-of those L.Rs are arrayed as parties to this proceeding.

5. Confronted with such situation, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he would rather withdraw the present petition with liberty to approach the competent authority afresh by furnishing better particulars for the purpose of availing the compensation.

6. With this observation, the writ petition is disposed of.
