1. All the ABLAPLs are disposed of by the following common order.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and Mr. Lenka, learned ASC for the State.
3. Instant petitions under Section 482 BNSS are filed for pre-arrest bail of the petitioners in connection with Daitari P.S. Case No.107 of 2025 corresponding to G.R. Case No.1221 of 2025 pending in the file of learned J.M.F.C. (Cog. Taking), Keonjhar on the grounds stated therein.



4. In course of hearing, it is submitted to the Court that some of the petitioners are having similar antecedents. The further submission is that this Court has allowed bail in respect of few other accused persons involved in the alleged incident, hence, the petitioners should be extended parity.

5. Perused the FIR as at Annexure-1 and it reveals that cattle were being transported in three vehicles intercepted by the local police.

6. Recorded the objection of the State to the effect that some of the accused persons are having criminal antecedents.

7. The bail orders in ABLAPLs vis-à-vis co-accused persons are at Flag-A to Flag-A3. This Court finds that the names of some of the accused persons are named in the FIR. Considering the general allegation against all the accused persons and release of the co-accused persons in the ABLAPLs, this Court is of the view that the petitioners should similarly be directed to surrender before the court concerned for being released on bail instead of pre-arrest bail, as has been demanded by them.

8. Accordingly, it is ordered.

9. In the result, ABLAPLs stand disposed of with the direction as aforesaid. It is further directed that in the event, the petitioners surrender before the court of learned J.M.F.C. (Cog. Taking), Keonjhar within a period of four weeks from today, they shall be released on bail in connection with Daitari P.S. Case No.107 of 2025 corresponding to G.R. Case No.1221 of



2025 subject to them furnishing a bail bond of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand) each with one solvent surety for the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below, which shall be at liberty to impose such other suitable conditions as deemed just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case besides the following, such as, they shall cooperate the I.O. in the investigation, till its completion.
