1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
 2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioners. Perused the CMP application as well as the prayer made therein.
 3. By filing the present CMP application, the Petitioners seek to challenge order dated 15.01.2026 passed by the learned District Judge, Nuapada in C.S. No.01 of 2018.
 4. Learned counsel for the Petitioners at the outset contended that although the power of attorney was duly authenticated by the Assistant Consular Officer, Embassy of India, Bangkok, the same has been rejected by the learned trial court questioning the authenticity and genuineness of the power of attorney.
 5. Considering the submission made by the learned counsel for the Petitioners, this Court is of the view that the matter requires further consideration in presence of the Opposite Parties.



6. Issue notice to the Opposite Parties by Speed Post with A.D. by fixing a short returnable date. Requisites be filed within three working days.
7. List this matter in the week commencing 30th March, 2026.
