- 01.** 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical) Mode.
- 2.** Heard learned counsel for the Parties.
- 3.** Petitioner has filed the present Writ Petition with the following prayer:-

“Under the circumstances, it is humbly therefore prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to issue a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ/writs by directing the opp. party No.3 to consider the case of the petitioner for modification of grade pay of ₹4600 instead of ₹4200 and grade pay of ₹5400 under 2nd and 3rd ACP/RACP with 3% increment under ACP/RACP and ORSP Rules, 2008 by considering the representation dated 13.05.2025 under annexure-8 which was forwarded by opp. party no.3 under annexure-8 within a stipulated period;



And further be pleased to direct the opp. parties to extend the benefit of arrear/revised pension after such modification with all consequential benefits;

Or pass any other order/orders as this Hon'ble Court may think deem fit and proper;

And allow this writ application.”

4. Learned counsel for the Petitioner submits that through highlighting his grievances, the petitioner has filed a representation vide Annexure-8 to the Writ Petition, but till date nothing has been done in the matter. In such background, he prays that a direction be issued to the Opposite Party No.3 to take a decision on the above noted petition within a specific time period.

5. Considering the submissions made and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court directs the Opposite Party No.3 to take a decision on the above noted representation in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of production of certified copy of this order and communicate the result of such exercise to the petitioner.

6. The Writ Petition is disposed of accordingly.
