1. Heard Mr. S. Panda, learned counsel for the appellant.
 2. This writ appeal is directed against the order dated 05.02.2026 passed by the learned Single Judge in W.P.(C) No.3207 of 2026. Relevant paragraphs of the said order dated 05.02.2026 is reproduced herein:-

“6. At this point of time, learned counsel for the petitioner contended that on the face of the order issued under Annexure-8 on 18.12.2025, petitioner because of his health issue, has not yet joined and he is ready and willing to join in the place of transfer, if he will be allowed further 2 (two) weeks' time.

7. Having heard learned counsel for the parties and considering the submissions made, this Court while not interfering with the orders issued under Annexure-6 and 8, permits the petitioner to join in terms of order at Annexure-8 on or before 20.02.2026. Opp. Party-Bank is



directed to permit the petitioner to remain on leave till he joins on or before 20.02.2026.”

3. Having conceded to join at the place of transfer, the appellant has come up before this Court, questioning the recording of finding dated 05.02.2026 with respect to the concession made before the learned Single Judge. Therefore, this Court is not persuaded with such a recourse being taken by the appellant-writ petitioner.

4. During course of hearing, learned counsel for the appellant sought for leave to withdraw this Writ Appeal with liberty to the appellant to pursue his remedy before the appropriate forum in accordance with law, and to that extent he files a Memo in Court today stating the same. The memo is taken on record.

5. In view of the above, this Writ Appeal stands dismissed as withdrawn, granting liberty to the appellant as sought for.
