1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the Opp. Parties.
3. Petitioner has filed the present writ petition inter alia with the following prayer:-

*“nder this fact and circumstances humbly prayed that
this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to*

*(i) direct / order the Opp. Parties to release the Family
Pension in favour of the Petitioner and in her favour of
two Children as per the Clause-16 of the Employees'
Pension Scheme, 1995.*

*(ii) And may pass such any other Order / Orders, as
would be just deem fit and proper.*

*And for this act of your kindness, the Petitioner shall
as in duty, ever pray.”*

4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a fresh representation before Opp. Party No. 1 by enclosing all the relevant



documents and citations in support of his claim, if any, within a period of three (3) weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such representation is filed within the aforesaid time period, Opp. Party No. 1 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by Opp. Party No. 1 be communicated to the Petitioner.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
