W.P.(C) No.8461 of 2026 and I.A. No.5012 of 2026

Learned counsel appearing for the Petitioner-Borrower vehemently submits that as on 07.10.2024, about 19,50,000/- (Rupees Nineteen Lakh Fifty Thousand) only was outstanding. In September, 2025, Petitioner has credited a sum of Rs.2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lakh Fifty Thousand) only to the loan account. There was some financial difficulty, which Borrower was facing and therefore, much debt servicing could not be done and that now, he is ready and willing to go for One Time Settlement (OTS) and to show *bona fide*, he would credit 25% of the outstanding amount to the loan account in question, if a reasonable ease is accorded. Matter requires due examination and a case is made out for issuance of emergent notice and grant of reprieve.



2. Issue emergent notice to sole OP by speed post returnable within two weeks, requisites for which shall be furnished within three working days.

In the above circumstances, the application in I.A. No.5012 of 2026, supported by affidavit, having been favoured, all coercive proceedings are halted, subject to Petitioner depositing 25% of the outstanding amount in the manner as under:

10% in two weeks, another 10% in two more weeks and the remainder in one week.

Petitioner is put to warning that in event, this facility is not availed, the interim order stands rescinded and also Petition runs the risk of dismissal on that ground *per se*.
