Order No. 01

1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the Opp. Parties.
3. Petitioner has filed the present writ petition inter alia with the following prayer:-

“It is, therefore, humbly prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to admit the writ petition, call for records, issue notice to the Opp. Parties to show cause as to why appropriate writ/writs shall not be issued and on perusal of causes shown if any or upon insufficient causes shown and after hearing the parties, direct the Opposite Parties to release the differential arrear salary as has been granted to other similarly placed persons and grant NOC to the petitioner with in a stipulated period in order to join apply for further employment.

And on perusal of causes shown if any or upon insufficient causes shown, make the said rule absolute and may pass any appropriate order as deemed just and proper.



*And for this act of your kindness, the petitioner shall
as in duty bound shall ever pray.”*

4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a fresh representation before Opp. Party No. 2 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of his claim, if any, within a period of three (3) weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such representation is filed within the aforesaid time period, Opp. Party No. 2 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by Opp. Party No. 2 be communicated to the Petitioner.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
