Order No. 01

1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. At the outset, learned counsel appearing for the Petitioners contended that the Writ Petition be confined to Petitioner No.1 only and liberty be given to file separate Writ Petitions in respect of other Petitioners. Such prayer is allowed.
3. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the Opp. Parties.
4. Petitioner has filed the present writ petition inter alia with the following prayer:-

“The petitioner therefore prayed that your lordship would be graciously pleased to admit the writ application, issued notice to the Opp. Parties and after hearing the parties quash the dissolution order dated 17.02.2026 issued by the Opp.party No-3 under Annexure-5 and direction be issue to continue the petitioners as per their engagement /offer letter under Annexure-3 series and also necessary direction be issue for disbursement of monthly remuneration of the petitioners within a stipulated time.”



Or appropriate order/orders, issue any other direction/directions as the Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the interest of justice;

And for which act of kindness the petitioners shall duty bound ever pray.”

5. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a fresh representation before Opp. Party No.1 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of his claim, if any, within a period of three (3) weeks hence.

6. It is observed that if such representation is filed within the aforesaid time period, Opp. Party No. 1 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by Opp. Party No. 1 be communicated to the Petitioner.

7. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
