01. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical) Mode.

2. Heard learned counsel for the parties.

3. Even though the present Writ Petition has been filed *inter alia* challenging notice dated 05.03.2026 under Annexure-3, wherein petitioner has been directed to vacate the Qr. No.8/3, Type-2, but in course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner fairly contended that petitioner will vacate the quarter if she will be allowed to remain in occupation of the same till 19.06.2026.

3.1. It is also contended that petitioner is ready and willing to furnish an undertaking that she will vacate the quarter suo-moto by 19.06.2026.



4. Learned Addl. Standing Counsel has no serious objection to the course of action proposed by the learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. Having heard learned counsel for the parties and considering the submission made, this Court while disposing the Writ Petition, without interfering with the impugned notice, permits the petitioner to remain in occupation of the quarter till 19.06.2026.

5.1. However, petitioner is directed to file an undertaking by way of an affidavit indicating therein that petitioner will vacate the quarter by 19.06.2026 positively. It is however observed that if petitioner does not vacate the quarter by 19.06.2026, she can be evicted without issuance of any fresh notice.

6. The Writ Petition stands disposed of.
