1. This CRLMP has been filed for a direction to Opposite Parties No.2 and 3 to register the written complaint dated 23.02.2026 and to take action against the Opposite Party No.4 on basis of the FIR under Annexure-1 as well as realize Rs.3,00,000/- which has been taken by Opposite Party No.4.

2. The name of Mr. Satyajit Routray has not been mentioned on top of the brief or in the cause list. This is due to the oversight



of the Registry as his name is mentioned in the Vakalatnama and he has signed the Vakalatnama.

3. The allegations of the Petitioner is that the father of the Petitioner had paid Rs.3 lakhs to the Opposite Party No.4 for issuing an appointment order to the Petitioner as an attendant in the Community Health Centre, Sarankul. But as he was not given any pay nor the amount returned to him, he had complained to the CDMO, Nayagarh and also lodged FIR at the Sarankul Police Station on 23.02.2026. But no case was registered, representation / petition was sent to the Opposite Party No.2-S.P., Nayagarh by speed post on 09.03.2026, but to no avail, hence this CRLMP.

4. In view of the allegation that money was paid to the Opposite Party No.4 - Dr. Tapas Ranjan Senapati, for securing a job, I do not consider this to be a fit case to exercise jurisdiction under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue any direction.

5. The CRLMP is disposed of.

6. The Petitioner is at liberty to avail of the alternative remedy which is available to him.
