01. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
2. This matter was not in today's list, however, on being mentioned this matter is taken up today in special list.
3. This is an application filed by the Petitioner seeking release on interim bail.
4. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner as well as learned counsel for the State. Perused the application.
5. On perusal of the I.A. application, it appears that the Petitioner has made a prayer for his release on interim bail on the ground of his illness and for his better treatment.
6. Learned counsel for the Petitioner at the outset referred to order dated 24.11.2025 passed in I.A. No.874 of 2025 arising



out of the present bail application and contended that the Petitioner is suffering from a chronic kidney disease (CKD) was advised to undergo kidney transplant surgery at Medicover Hospital, Visakhapatnam. Considering such prayer this Court vide order dated 24.11.2025 permitted the Petitioner to go on interim bail for a period of two months. Learned counsel for the Petitioner at this juncture submitted that during such interim bail period the Petitioner has undergone a kidney transplant surgery. He further contended that presently the Petitioner is required to undergo follow-up medical check-up at the same hospital under the Nephrologist and for that reason the Petitioner is required to go on interim bail.

7. Learned counsel for the State on the other hand contended that he has no instruction in the matter.

8. Taking into consideration the aforesaid fact, this Court is inclined to release the Petitioner on interim bail for a period of four weeks and the period of interim bail shall be counted from the date of his release from custody. The release of the Petitioner on interim bail would be subject to such terms and conditions as would be deemed just and proper by the learned trial court.

9. On expiry of the interim bail period, the Petitioner shall surrender immediately before the court below, failing which, it is open to the court below to take coercive action against the



Petitioner to ensure that the Petitioner is taken back into custody.

10. Accordingly, I.A. stands disposed of.

11. Issue urgent certified copy of this order as per rules in course of the day.
