01. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioners as well as learned counsel for the State. Perused the application as well as the prayer made therein.
3. By filing the present application under Section 482 of the Cr.P.C. the Petitioners seek quashing of the entire criminal proceeding arising out of Simuia P.S. Case No.233 of 2020.
4. Learned counsel for the Petitioners at the outset contended that in the meantime the matter has been settled between the parties on



compromise. He further submitted that although the allegation has been made under Section 307 of the I.P.C., however the injuries are simple in nature.

5. Considering the aforesaid facts, this Court is inclined to issue notice to the Opposite parties.

6. Learned Additional Standing Counsel accepts notice on behalf of the Opposite Party No.1, extra copy of the brief be served on him within three working days.

7. Issue notice to the Opposite Party Nos.2 to 7 by Registered Post with A.D. by fixing a short returnable date. Requisites be filed within three working days.

8. List this matter along with D-CRLMC No.24693 of 2025 in the week commencing 15th September, 2025. In the meantime, learned counsel for the State shall obtain the Case Diary as well as the injury report and also take instruction from the IIC of the concerned police station on the affidavit at Annexure-4 to the present application.

10. As an interim measure, it is directed that on an application being filed by the petitioners seeking adjournment, the learned trial court shall do well to adjourn the matter for a period of six weeks.
