1. It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that against an order directing to pay interim maintenance for an amount of Rs.6,000/- per month to each of the parents within 10 days of each month from the date of order, *i.e.*, 30.11.2022 passed by the learned Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Talcher, an application under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. (corresponds to Section 528 of BNSS) is pending before this Court. However, the Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Talcher by order dated 09.12.2024 invoking powers under Section 9(2) of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 directed the present petitioner to deposit/transfer the amount of Rs.2,000/- to each of the parents every month in/to the bank account.



2. While the matter stood thus, the Sub-Collector, Talcher by letter dated 21.05.2026 directed the Personnel Manager, Bharatpur OCP, MCL to deduct an amount of Rs.7,000/- from the salary of the petitioner.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner vehemently contended that such direction to deduct the enhanced amount to be paid to the parents of the petitioner has been ordered in flagrant violation of principles of natural justice. It is also submitted that appreciating such submission, this Court *vide* order dated 03.07.2026 directed that “*operation of letter No.1592 dated 21.05.2026 issued by the Sub-Collector and Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Talcher, Angul shall remain stayed till the next date of listing of this matter.*” He, therefore, submitted that as observed in the said order, this Court simultaneously transferred this Court to settle the dispute amicably by the petitioner with his parents. It is further submitted that the petitioner has taken steps to settle the dispute with his parents and there is every possibility of resolution of dispute.
4. Perusal of record reveals that no notice has been issued to the opposite parties. Hence, issue notice to the opposite parties.
 - 4.1. Mr. Jayant Kumar Bal, learned Addl. Government Advocate appears and waives issue of notice on behalf of opposite party No.1 since he has already received the copy of the writ petition.
 - 4.2. Notice be issued to opposite party Nos.2, 3 and 4 by Speed Post with A.D., requisites for which shall be filed within three



working days. The notice shall be made returnable before the next date.

5. List this matter on 3rd September, 2026.
6. Interim order dated 03.07.2026 shall remain in force till the next date.
