02. 1. Heard learned counsel for the both the Parties.
2. By means of this Application, the Petitioner seeks the following relief:-

“The petitioner therefore most humbly prays that this Hon'ble Court would graciously be pleased to admit this writ petition, call for the records and after hearing the parties, allow the same by issuing a writ / writs in the nature of certiorari / mandamus declaring that the recording at Col. No. 3 of the ROR (Annexure - 3) as Pattadar status in respect of the land pertaining to Plot No. 1639 (Gharabari), Area - Ac.0.200 dec., Plot No. 2253 (Gharabari), Area - Ac.275 dec. and Plot No. 2254 (Gharabari), Area - Ac.0.355 dec., total area - Ac.0.830 dec. under Khata No. 2077/1 of Mouza - Sankarpur, Tahasil - Bhubaneswar, Dist.- Khurda, is illegal and similarly in the ROR (Annexure-1) as "Dakhal Satwa Sunya" status is also illegal, hence the Tahasildar, Bhubaneswar be directed to correct such entry in the ROR (Annexure - 3) and issue Stitiban Patta to the petitioner in respect of the case land ;”

3. It is stated at the Bar that the case of the Petitioner is covered by the principles laid down by the Coordinate Bench of this Court in ***Gargi Dash vs. State of Odisha & others*** decided in **W.P.(C) No.2870 of 2026 (and batch cases)**.



4. Considering the submissions as above, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the claim of the Petitioner, the Writ Petition is disposed of directing the Opp. Party No.4 i.e. Additional Tahasildar, Bhubaneswar, Dist- Khurda, to consider the prayer of the Petitioner in light of **Gargi Dash** (supra) and pass a reasoned order in accordance with law after affording an opportunity of hearing to the Petitioner.

5. The aforesaid exercise shall be completed within a period of four (4) weeks from the date of communication of this order.
