1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. This is an application by the petitioner for grant of interim bail on the ground of self illness.
3. Heard, Ms. Chandana Tripathy, learned proxy counsel appearing on behalf of Mr. Soumya Mishra, learned counsel for the Petitioner and Mr. J.P. Patra, learned counsel for the OPID in the matter and perused the record.
4. According to the submission of learned counsel for the Petitioner, the Petitioner was granted interim bail and accordingly, he availed interim bail w.e.f 06.06.2025 to 04.07.2025, but again the Petitioner is praying for interim bail on the ground that he will undergo surgery. However, the written instruction



submitted by IO as produced by the learned counsel for the OPID reveals as under in paragraph-12:-

"12. That in obedience to the order of Hon'ble OPID Court, Cuttack dtd. 06.06.2025, necessary escort (one Sub-Inspector and ¼ APR force) was provided by DCP, Cuttack and the accused-petitioner was received from Choudwar Jail on 07.06.2025 and was taken to Apollo Hospital, Bhubaneswar for his treatment. But the accused petitioner denied for doing his heart surgery/treatment at Apollo Hospital, on the pretext that his family members were not with him and he does not possess any medical documents for his treatment. Thereafter, two Sub-Inspectors with ¼ APR force have been provided by DCP, Bhubaneswar to perform PSO duty as rotation basis for any emergency, safety and security of the accused petitioner. During his interim bail period from dtd 07.06.2025 to 04.07.2025 (04 weeks), the petitioner stayed in Hotel Royal Lagoon in room No. 102, situated at Raj Mahal Chhak, Bhubaneswar. Though, he had visited AIIMS Hospital, Bhubaneswar for many times, but he avoided his heart surgery, taking various pleas. Further, during the interim bail period, the accused petitioner did not co-operate with the escort party."

It, therefore, appears that the Petitioner wants to avail interim bail on the ground of illness only, but he is not interested for his treatment. In this situation, this Court is not inclined to grant interim bail to the petitioner any further, but, however, directs the jail authority to provide appropriate treatment in custody, if the same is required.



5. Hence, the IA stands disposed of. Issue urgent certified copy of this order as per Rules.

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6. On the prayer of the learned counsel for the petitioner, list this matter in the week commencing from 21.07.2025.
