1. Heard learned counsel for the respective parties.
2. Instant CRLMP is filed by the petitioner for a direction to the opposite parties and in particular, opposite party No.3 to take steps to register a case on the report i.e. Annexure-1 series and to investigate into the allegations therein supervised by opposite party No.2 and to pass such other orders as deemed fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case.
3. A copy of the agreement at Annexure-3 is gone through.
4. Recorded the submission of Mr. Mohanty, learned counsel for the petitioner. It is submitted that report was received by the P.S. concerned but without any action and it has been intimated to the DCP concerned, namely, opposite party No.2 but again without any result. It is submitted that in view of the alleged mischief committed, investigation is necessary with the F.I.R. lodged hence, necessary direction is required to be issued to opposite party No.3.



5. Recorded the submission of Ms. Sahu, learned AGA for the State.

6. The petitioner complying the order dated 13th July, 2026 filed a memo along with the relevant documents including a copy of the legal notice as at Flag-10. Considering the above facts and submissions of learned counsel for the respective parties and since it is claimed that the report has not been entertained till date despite an intimation to opposite party No.2, this Court is inclined to direct immediate action thereon if in case a cognizable offence is allegedly committed by the petitioner and to take up investigation as per and in accordance with law without further delay.

7. Accordingly, it is ordered.

8. In the result, the CRLMP stands disposed of with the direction to opposite party No.3 to enquire in to the report i.e. Annexure-1 series and to take action as per law at the earliest preferably within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

9. Issue urgent certified copy as per rules.

10. A free copy of the order be handed over to Ms. Sahu, learned AGA for the State for intimation to opposite party No.3 for early compliance.
