- 01.** 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical) Mode.
- 2.** Heard learned counsel for the Parties.
- 3.** Petitioner has filed the present Writ Petition with the following prayer:-

“The petitioner most respectfully prays Hon’ble Court may be graciously pleased to allow this petition and that this quash the Letter No.4326/23, dated.27.08.2023 issued by the C.D.M.O, Sundargarh under Annexure-11 and further direct the Chief District Medical & Public Health Officer, Sundargarh, the Opp.Party No.4 to forward the pertaining documents of the petitioner who is continuing as daily wage driver under his establishment to the Opp. Party No.2 for the purpose of his regularization of service as driver in view of the Letter dtd.29.11.2025, 14.11.2025 & 05.05.2026 issued by Govt. and proceedings of the meeting of the High Power Committee Meeting held dt.03.10.2025 of Govt. in Health & Family Welfare Department, Odisha under Annexure-12 Series &13.



And pass any such other or further order or orders as may be deemed just and proper;

And for this act of kindness, the petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray.”

4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a detailed representation before Opp. Party No.4 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of his claim, if any, within a period of three weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such a representation is filed within the aforesaid period, Opp. Party No.4 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by the Opp. Party No.4 be communicated to the petitioner within the aforesaid time period.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
