03. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
2. Heard the learned counsel for the Petitioner as well as learned counsel for the State-Opposite Party No.1
3. It is stated by the learned counsel for the Petitioner that the Petitioner has married the victim in the meantime and a joint affidavit has been filed before this Court indicating the aforesaid facts.
4. It further appears that the victim and the Petitioner having blessed with a child in the meantime and living a happy conjugal life.



5. The aforesaid affidavit has been shown before the Oath Commissioner of this Court by both the Petitioner as well as Opposite Party No.3-Victim.
6. In view of the aforesaid position, this Court directs that the statement of the victim be recorded under Section 164 of Cr.P.C./Section 183 of B.N.S.S. by the learned Magistrate.
7. The Petitioner is directed to produce the victim before the learned Magistrate having jurisdiction for recording with her statement.
8. A copy of the statement of the victim recorded under Section 164 of Cr.P.C./Section 183 of B.N.S.S., 2023 be forwarded to this Court by the next date.
9. List this case in the week commencing 1st December, 2025.
10. As an interim measure, it is directed that no coercive action shall be taken against the Petitioner in connection with C.T. Case No.240 of 2023, corresponding to Jajpur Sadar P.S. Case No.28 of 2023, pending in the court of learned S.D.J.M., Jajpur, for a period of three weeks.
11. A free copy of this order be handed over to the learned counsel for the State.
