1. Heard Mr. Acharya, learned counsel for the petitioner and Ms. Dash, learned ASC for the State opposite party/contemnor.

2. The Court's order dated 12th September, 2024 passed in W.P.(C) No.18396 of 2024, since not complied with, the contempt petition is filed.

3. Mr. Acharya, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the opposite party/contemnor is still to comply the Court's direction and in reply, Ms. Dash, learned ASC for the State prays further six weeks' time to ensure compliance of the order in W.P.(C) No.18396 of 2024.

4. Considering the submissions as above, the contempt petition stands disposed of with a direction to the opposite party/contemnor to immediately comply the Court's order in W.P.(C) No.18396 of 2024 within the extended period of six



weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, failing which, it shall be visited with action under the Contempt of Courts Act.

6. A copy of the order be handed over to Ms. Dash, learned ASC for the State for its onward intimation to the opposite party/contemnor for immediate compliance.
