1. Heard learned counsel for the respective parties.
2. Today, a memo is filed by learned counsel for the opposite party with a copy of the judgment in MAT No.63 of 2020 and submits that the marriage between the parties has been dissolved. The memo with the copy of the judgment to be kept in record. Learned counsel for the petitioner is having no instructions regarding any such decree and dissolution of marriage as claimed by the opposite party.
3. The learned court below allowed monthly maintenance of Rs.2000/- by order dated 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2017 while disposing of CMC No.94 of 2015, whereas, the decree dissolving the marriage has arrived in 2022. The Court is inclined to consider payment of the monthly maintenance at least till 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2022, the date on which, the ex parte decree was obtained by the opposite party, hence, directs



learned counsel appearing for him to take instructions and reply. As an interim measure, opposite party is directed to pay an amount of Rs.50,000/- to the petitioner. The proof of such deposit shall be furnished to the Court on the next date of hearing. Awaiting instructions, in view of the above order, list this matter on 16<sup>th</sup> January, 2026 for final orders.
