1. This matter is taken up through hybrid arrangement.
2. Heard learned counsel for the parties.
3. The present Writ Petition has been filed by the Petitioner with the following prayer:

“It is therefore, humbly prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to issue rule NISI calling upon the Opp. Party - Bank to show cause as to why the Opp. Party - Bank is not allowing the Petitioner to operate the locker No.7 of his deceased father jointly held along with him in "either/or survivor clause" forthwith.

And if the Opp. Parties fail to show cause or show insufficient cause make the said Rule absolute by issuing a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the Opp. Party - Bank to allow the Petitioner to forthwith operate the locker no.7 of his deceased father jointly held along with him in "either/or survivor clause".

And further be pleased to pass any further order(s)/direction(s) as would be deemed fit and proper in the interest of justice;”



4. A joint affidavit has been filed by the Petitioner /Biswajit Das, Ayusmita Das and Ipsita Das stating therein that they have mutually agreed that the gold articles lying in Locker No.7 Medium, at Odisha Grameen Bank, Mahanadi Vihar Branch will be distributed equally between Biswajit Das (1st Party) and Ayusmita Das (2nd Party). Mrs. Ipsita Das the 3rd party has no objection to the aforesaid distribution. The said affidavit be kept on record.
5. Learned counsel for the Bank also files an additional affidavit stating that the Bank has no objection in carrying out the contents of the affidavit filed by the Petitioner. The said additional affidavit be kept on record.
6. In view of the above, this Court directs the Opposite Party/Bank to do well within fifteen days from the date of presentation of a copy of this order as per the banking norms.
7. Accordingly, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
