1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned Addl. Government Advocate for the State. Perused the records.
3. This is an application under Section 482 of BNSS, filed by the Petitioner for anticipatory bail, involving offence punishable under Sections 132, 121(1), 121(2), 109, 276, 277, 3(5) of BNS read with Section 21(b)/29 of NDPS Act in C.T.(Spl). Case No.66 of 2024 arising out of Bargarh P.S. Case No.447 of 2024 of the Court of learned Additional District & Sessions Judge-cum-Judge, Special Court, Bargarh.
4. Considering the submissions of the learned counsel for the parties, it is observed that the Petitioner, if so advised, may surrender before the learned Additional District & Sessions Judge-cum-Judge, Special Court, Bargarh, in the aforesaid case within four weeks from



today. In the event the Petitioner surrenders and moves for bail within the aforesaid period, learned Additional District & Sessions Judge-cum-Judge, Special Court, Bargarh, shall do well to dispose of the bail application of the Petitioner on the same day on merit in accordance with law. Further, while considering the bail application of the Petitioner, learned Court in seisin over the matter shall apply the principles of parity. The case diary be made available to the concerned court to facilitate disposal of the bail application of the Petitioner.

5. The ABLAPL is disposed of accordingly.
6. Urgent certified copy of this order be granted as per rules.
