1. Heard Mr. Sahu, learned counsel representing Mr. Panturu, learned counsel for the petitioner.
2. Instant IA is filed under Section 5 of the Limitation Act seeking condonation of delay.
3. It is submitted to the Court that the petitioner filed CRLMC No.425 of 2025 disposed of on 17th September, 2025 with the liberty granted for him to file a revision to challenge the order of cognizance, hence, the delay.
4. A delay of 730 days is reported as per the SR.
5. Recorded the objection of Mr. Sahoo, learned ASC for the State.



6. Since, the liberty has been granted by this Court in CRLMC No.425 of 2025 and even though there has been delay, the same is required to be condoned in the interest of justice for a decision in the revision on merit for considering legality of the order of cognizance dated 31st October, 2022.

7. Accordingly, it is ordered.

8. IA is allowed with delay being condoned.

1. Heard.

2. Instant revision is filed by the petitioner challenging the order of cognizance at Annexure-3.

3. It is submitted to the Court that the petitioner is a friend of the informant's husband and she has been alleged of having committed an offence punishable Section 506 IPC. The plea of the petitioner is that no such offence is made out against her, hence, the order of cognizance at Annexure-3 is not legally tenable.

4. To consider and appreciate the above plea and submission of Mr. Sahu, learned counsel for the petitioner, the Court is inclined to issue notice to opposite party No.2 and also consider the response of the State.



5. Call for soft copy of the LCR from the learned court below.
6. Notice to opposite party No.2 by Speed Post with a short returnable date and for the said purpose, requisites shall be filed by learned counsel for the petitioner within seven days
7. List on 12th January, 2026 for final hearing and orders on appearance of opposite party No.2 and receipt of the LCR.
