03. 1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. Petitioner in this writ petition prays for the following relief

Therefore, it is humbly prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to admit the Writ Petition, issue notice to the opposite parties to show cause as to why:-

i) the Special Land Acquisition Officer, opposite party No-3, shall not be directed not to disburse the award amount in respect of 2 anna 8 pahi share of Bhagabat Tarai in the 'case land' in favour of opposite parties No-4 toll, basing on the award framed vide Annexure-4, till adjudication of the right, title of the parties in the Civil Suit;

And if the opposite parties fail to show cause or show in sufficient/false cause, after hearing be pleased to direct the opposite party No-3 not to disburse award amount in respect of 2anna 8 pahi share of Bhagu Tarai in favour of opposite parties during pendency of the Civil Suit No- C.S.No-

may deem just and proper in the interest of justice;

3. Mr. Behera, learned counsel for the Petitioners submits that in the meantime, the Land Acquisition Officer has disbursed the compensation amount. Thus, he files a memo for withdrawal of the writ petition seeking liberty to file a fresh one with better particulars. The memo so filed is taken on record.

4. Mr. Dash, learned Additional Standing Counsel does not have any objection to the same.

5. In view of the submission made by Mr. Behera, learned counsel for the Petitioner, the writ petition is disposed of as withdrawn, with a liberty to the Petitioner to file a fresh writ petition with better particulars within a period of one month hence.
