1. This is an application U/S.483 of BNSS by the petitioner for grant of bail in connection with Dhanupali P.S. Case No. 380 of 2022 corresponding to G.R. Case No. 3835 of 2022 pending in the file of S.D.J.M, Sambalpur, for commission of offences punishable U/Ss. 399/402 of IPC, on the main allegation of congregating in an isolated place, along with co-accused persons being armed with lethal weapons and preparing to commit dacoity in some area.

2. Heard, Ms. Mohini Sahoo, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. T.K. Acharya, learned Addl. PP in the matter and perused the record.

3. After having considered the rival submissions and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offence as alleged against the petitioner vis-à-vis the accusations sought to be brought against him and regard being had to the pre-trial detention of the petitioner in custody since 20.09.2025 with submission of charge sheet in the meantime and taking into account the other circumstance on record in entirety including the inherent right of the accused to be presumed innocent until proven



guilty at the trial, this Court without expressing any view on merit, admits the petitioner to bail.

4. Hence, the bail application of the Petitioner stands allowed and the Petitioner is allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty-five Thousand) only with two solvent sureties each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin of the case on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it.

5. Accordingly, the BLAPL stands disposed of. Issue urgent certified copy of the order as per Rules. A soft copy of this order be immediately communicated to the concerned Court, who shall afterwards communicate the same to the concerned Jail through e-mail for reference.
