1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. This is a bail application U/S.483 of BNSS by the petitioner for grant of bail in connection with Sasan PS Case No.84 of 2024 corresponding to GR Case No.331 of 2024 pending in the file of learned Addl. Sessions Judge-1, Sambalpur for commission of offences punishable U/Ss.302 of IPC, on the main allegation of committing murder of one Raja Bisi by assaulting him with a Cricket Bat.
3. Heard, Mr. Sidhartha Shankar Sarangi, learned counsel for the petitioner appearing virtually and Mr. T.K. Acharya, learned Additional Public Prosecutor in the matter and perused the record.
4. After having considered the rival submissions and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offences as alleged against the petitioner vis-a-vis the accusation sought to be brought against him and regard being had to the pre-trial detention of the petitioner in custody since 20.04.2024 with submission of charge-sheet in the meantime and taking into account the circumstances



under which the deceased died and keeping in view the materials placed on record in entirety including the inherent right of the accused to be presumed innocent until proven guilty at the trial and there being no direct evidence available against the petitioner, this Court without expressing any view on merit admits the petitioner to bail.

5. Hence, the bail application of the petitioner stands allowed and the petitioner is allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand) only with two solvent sureties each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin of the case on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it.

6. Accordingly, the BLAPL stands disposed of.
