1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
 2. Heard learned counsel for the Parties.
 3. Although learned counsel for the Contemnors-Opposite Parties- stated before this Court that the State-Opposite Parties have preferred SLP before the Hon'ble the Supreme Court and the same is stated to be pending. However, they were unable to produce any interim order staying the further proceeding in the contempt application.



4. On perusal of the order-sheet it appears that the Petitioner who had succeeded in the writ application is waiting to avail the benefits of the order passed by this Court on 27.02.2026. Despite such order having been passed by this Court he has not received the benefits of such order.

5. Considering the submissions made by the learned counsel appearing for the Contemnors-Opposite Parties, further keeping in view the plight of the Petitioner who has been waiting to get justice, this Court directs the Opposite Parties to implement the order passed by this Court which shall obviously be subject to the outcome of the pending SLP within a period of four weeks, failing which the Contemnors-Opposite Parties shall be asked to appear before this Court at 10.30 A.M on 21.05.2026. In the event the order is implemented the direction to the Opposite Parties for their personal appearance before this Court shall stand automatically waived.

6. List this matter on 21.05.2026.

7. A free copy of this order be handed over to the learned counsel for the Contemnor -Opposite Parties for compliance.
